A Word from Andrew We live in a sceptical age. Fake news, amazing special effects and "scientism" don't make it easy to accept the existence of miracles! So why believe in the resurrection? I reckon the changed lives of the disciples is one of the most compelling reasons. Philip Yancey writes in "The Jesus I never knew": "We who read the Gospels from the other side of Easter forget how hard it was for the disciples to believe... Convincing these sceptics would require intimate, personal encounters with the one

who had been their Master for three years, and over the next six weeks, Jesus provided exactly that. The appearances were not glamorous. No angels in the sky singing hymns, no kings from afar bearing gifts. Jesus showed up in the most ordinary of circumstances: a private dinner, two men walking along a road, a woman weeping in a garden, some fishermen working on a lake." So, let's join them in proclaiming, "Jesus is risen!"

Dedication Service (normal time of 10.30am) as a number of families commit their children to God and God's purposes. As part of the celebration, please bring a plate of food to share after the service.

Freely "... and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." Romans 5:5 The word freely means "spontaneously; without constraint or persuasion."

When the Lord, in the person of the Holy Spirit, comes to dwell in our heart, He brings love with Him, because God is love (see 1 John 4:8).



It's important to ask what we are doing with the love of God that has been freely given to us. Are we rejecting it because we don't think we are valuable enough to be loved? Do we believe God is like other people who have rejected and hurt us? Or are we receiving His love by faith, believing that He is greater than our failures and weaknesses?

With God's help, we can love ourselves—not in a selfish way, but in a balanced, godly way; a way that simply affirms God's creation as essentially good and right. God's plan is this: for us to receive His love freely, love ourselves in a godly way, generously love Him in return, and finally love all the people who come into our lives.



Prayer Starter: Father, thank You for Your abundant love. Help me to freely receive Your love, love myself, then pour out Your love to those around me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
