Dallas Willard, in his classic work, "The Divine Conspiracy" describes the people that God loves and accepts: "The flunkouts and drop-outs and burned-outs. The broke and the broken. The drug heads and the divorced. The HIV-positive and herpes-ridden. The brain-damaged, the incurably ill. The barren and the pregnant too many times or at the wrong time. The over-employed, the underemployed, the unemployed. The unemployable"



As we tackle the sensitive topic of sexual intimacy, there is no room for superiority. We are all prone to sin and need to keep receiving - and offering - God's grace.



Baptism Sunday 4th August <u>at 1pm</u>



5. What is an action point from today's reading?


Staying Power

[Looking away from all that will distract us and] focusing our eyes on Jesus, who is the Author and Perfecter of faith [the first incentive for our belief and the One who brings our faith to maturity] Hebrews 12:2

People who finish well in life are the ones with strong character. As believers, we can be grateful that the Holy Spirit is developing the character in us that we need to do what God calls us to do—we have "staying power."

Jesus did not quit when His circumstances were rough, and He is our example. The Bible says we are to look away from all that distracts and look to Jesus instead.
