ASTOR'S F word from the heart

Recently a radical shake-up of New Zealand's abortion laws was proposed in our parliament. The taking of the life of an unborn child is still technically illegal in NZ but it is relatively easy to obtain. The new law aims to bring the law more in line with actual practice. But the most disturbing part is that the current proposal will make it much easier to get an abortion up to 20 weeks.

On Thursday, 94 MPs voted for and 23 against passing the bill on to Select Committee. Many people, especially Christians, will be deeply disturbed by this. The rights of women are important of course, but what about the rights of the unborn child?



Prediction: The Select Committee will be inundated with submissions, mainly against the proposed law changes and they will dismiss most of them as being "religiously motivated". Should we give up? Of course not. We must try. But we must also pray and support organisations like Pregnancy Counselling Services. May God save the children!

25 Union Street Parish Council Update

As part of our due diligence process on the purchase of 25 Union Street we have reviewed the estimated costs associated with the floor strengthening required by the Auckland Council and the expected renovation costs. These were found to be within the budgeted amounts previously presented to the congregation.



The Parish Council has also performed a legal, financial and building/property review, and identified any possible risks and associated mitigation.

The conclusion was that the Parish Council felt comfortable to proceed, and consequently unanimously approved to proceed to going unconditional on 25 Union Street. Settlement date will be the 21st August 2019. Please continue to pray for the logistics associated with the building, and those taking part in this work.
