Imagine being imprisoned for 19 years simply for the crime of stealing a loaf of bread! That's what happened to Jean Valjean

in Victor Hugo's sprawling novel, Les Miserables. Jean was understandably bitter. So when a kindly bishop offered him hospitality, he thought he'd help himself to some silverware after dark. Disastrously, he was picked up by some gendarmes (police) who brought him back to the bishop's house. But rather than accuse Jean, the bishop said they were gifts and gave him the candlesticks as well! This act of grace began a change in Jean's heart which impacted the lives of many people. I mention "Les Mis" today because our family was able to go to the musical at The Civic on Friday night (28 years after seeing it last time). Les Mis not only has unforgettable music, but a message that everyone needs to hear: the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A Daily Offering

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God – this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will." Romans 12:1-2 (NIV-UK)

The phrase "living sacrifice" seems like an oxymoron. In the Old Testament, animals

were killed to cover people's sins. If it wasn't killed, it wasn't sacrificed. But now we are called to be living sacrifices. What does this mean? In one sense, we have died - to our old, sinful selves. We are no longer who we used to be. But then we have been born again in Christ. And now that we live again, we should offer ourselves completely to God, day after day, as living sacrifices. This is how we properly worship God, by giving him our all.



Pray: Thank you for your mercy! I offer myself to you - my gifts and gaffes, my joys and jobs. Renew my mind so I may know and do your will.
